

# Pupil Premium Provision Map 2016-17 Enrichment/Engagement

## Cultural Celebration Week

All pupils including dis-advantaged pupils take part in a week of British values and cultural celebrations. Specialists from the fields of arts/crafts and music explore the many cultural traditions present in Great Britain today.

**Aim/Outcomes:** Dis-advantaged pupils develop important values that translate to learning. They develop positive relationships with their peers and celebrate their differences. Positive experiences of school develop self-confidence and engagement.  
£3000

## Residential

Trips are subsidised for PPG pupils each year providing an exciting outdoor and adventurous experience.

**Aim/Outcomes:** Developing positive relationships with peers and staff. Pupils overcome challenges and develop self-confidence and determination.

## Themed Learning Weeks: Science, Maths and Aspirations

Pupils have the opportunity to experience a wide range of new maths and science games and resources. They explore the world of work. Parents and specialists invited into school to participate and share their expertise.

**Aim/Outcomes:** Increase self-esteem, aspirations and engagement.  
£4000 resource implications and visiting speakers

## PE and After-school sports clubs

Pupils have the opportunity to experience a wide range of new sports and activities during and after school. The school employs a PE specialist to teach PE to the junior classes and run an after school club. Teachers and Assistants run a range of after school activities.

**Aim/Outcomes:** Increase pupil self-esteem and participation in school activities. Develop self-motivation and fine and gross motor skills. Providing positive experiences at school and opportunities to experience success.  
£8,000

## Music Lessons

Pupils have the opportunity to learn a string and wind instrument over two years. School subsidises music lessons for all pupils including disadvantaged children. Bolton music specialist employed 1 day a week

**Aim/Outcomes:** Provide positive experiences at school Increase self-esteem and develop knowledge and skills that transfer to classroom learning for example, perseverance, concentration, listening and thinking skills.  
£ 11,000

## After-school Cookery club

Disadvantaged pupils have the opportunity to participate in a healthy cooking club in spring and summer.

**Aim/outcomes:** Positive engagement and participation in school activities Pupils will develop skills that will translate to learning in the classroom in particular maths. Improved confidence and raised self-esteem.

## Before And After School Club

Families and pupils are able to utilise before and after school care which supports vulnerable families and those parents (many of whom are single parent families) to improve outcomes for themselves and their children.

**Aim/Outcomes:** Families of PPG pupils feel well supported by school and this has a positive impact on home school relationship and improved pupil attendance.

## The School Choir

Pupils participate in the school choir and engage in public performances. There are currently 16 PPG pupils involved in the choir.

**Aim/Outcomes-** positive experiences and engagement in school. Developing a range of skills that can transfer to classroom learning. Concentration, listening, perseverance etc.

## End of Year Celebration and Prize Giving

PPG pupils from all year groups receive a range of rewards at the end of the year for their academic and sporting achievements. Every Y6 pupil receives an award to celebrate their time at school

**Aim/Outcomes:** Pupils recognize that hard work and a positive attitude brings rewards. They are reflective of their school experiences and have high expectation as they move on.
